BACKGROUND

The Australian Community Education College Pty Ltd (the RTO) was first registered on 11 January 2011. The RTO is approved to delivered the following courses:

- CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care
- CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care

The RTO is part of a larger organisation, Centresupport, which provides assistance, consultation and resources to over 4000 child care centres. Centresupport also has a child care centre it operates in Dubbo.

The RTO conducts training primarily in New South Wales, Queensland, Western Australia and the Australian Capital Territory, with some programs being offered in regional and remote areas such as

Cobar, Wilcannia and Walgett. The majority of the RTO's training is conducted in the workplace and is offered through government funded traineeships or programs such as Smart and Skilled. The RTO also offers direct fee for service training to the public and Recognition of Prior Learning for existing workers in the Child Care sector.

The RTO stated at audit that future directions may include applying for a course such as BSB42015 Certificate IV in Leadership and Management, so that child care workers gain skills and knowledge that will allow them to articulate into child care centre manager/supervisor roles, or receive formal recognition for those already working within that role.

 - The TAS does not provide sufficient information to advise the structure and timing of work placement or provide a framework to outline how assessment will be managed within work placement.

- The Training and Assessment Strategy (TAS) for this course does not meet the requirements of Clause 1.1. Specifically:
 - The TAS does not provide sufficient information to advise the structure and timing of work placement or provide a framework to outline how assessment will be managed within work placement.

- The documents also identify the delivery and assessment arrangements for all units within each qualification.

 The RTO did not demonstrate that it has a mechanism in place to ensure that the workplaces its students attend have all the necessary resources and equipment, as required by the training package.

• Provide evidence to demonstrate how it ensures that its learners have access to all the necessary resources and equipment, as required by the training package.

- The RTO provided a copy of the document "Induction Student Visit Record Sheet" which includes
 a list of resources, facilities and equipment required for the learner to undertake and complete
 their training and assessment. The document is to be signed by the facility director, student and
 trainer to verify that the student has access to these items for the purposes of training and
 assessment.

Specifically, the Director described industry engagement strategies that were inconsistent with those described in the RTO's policies and procedures manual.

CHCECE005 Provide care to babies and toddlers

- The assessment tools do not meet the requirements of the training package. Specifically:
 - It is not clear that observation is undertaken of the learner liaising with families, such is required by 1.1, 2.4, 4.1, 6.1, 6.2, 6.3 and skills required by the Performance Evidence such as interacting with babies and their caregivers.
 - The assessment tools do not gather evidence of the practical application of skills required by Performance Criteria 2.3, 4.2, 4.4, 4.5 and Element 5. Although these skills are assessed through theory assessments, there is currently no requirement for their practical demonstration in the observation assessment.
- The assessment tools provided do not demonstrate that assessment will be conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and rules of evidence. Specifically:

- The observation checklist does not gather sufficient evidence of competency, as it does include provision to verify the demonstrations of all skills required by the checklist in the provision of care to three different babies and toddlers.
- o In addition, the activities in the observation checklist are signed off by the supervisor and not individually signed off by the assessor, so it is not evident that the assessor is responsible for observing and verifying the learner's demonstration of skills.
- o The tools are not reliable as they do not provide the context and conditions of assessment for the practical assessment of this unit in the Work Placement Book.

CHCECE007 Develop positive and respectful relationships with children

- The assessment tools do not meet the requirements of the training package. Specifically:
 - o It is not evident that the tools gather evidence of the practical application of skills required by the Elements of the unit. The observation checklist currently only includes skills that are extracts from the Performance Evidence, so it is therefore unclear how learners are assessed on all skills reflected in the Elements.
- The assessment tools provided do not demonstrate that assessment will be conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and rules of evidence. Specifically:
 - the activities in the observation checklist are signed off by the supervisor and not individually signed off by the assessor, so it is not evident that the assessor is responsible for observing and verifying the learner's demonstration of skills.
 - The tools are not reliable as they do not provide the context and conditions of assessment for the practical assessment of this unit in the Work Placement Book.

CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care

CHCECE024 Design and implement the curriculum to foster children's learning and development

- The assessment tools do not meet the requirements of the training package. Specifically:
 - It is not evident that the tools gather evidence of the practical application of skills required by the Performance Criteria of the unit. Specifically, there is no observation being undertaken of the following skills Performance Criteria: 2.1, 2.2, 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5, 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5 and 5.1.
- The assessment tools provided do not demonstrate that assessment will be conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and rules of evidence. Specifically:
 - The task description is not defined for the practical observation checklist and the instructions do not clearly state what is required. For instance, the learner is required to develop a curriculum plan as part of their weekly activities and then deliver the plan, however, the observation checklist does not refer to the development and implementation of the plan as part of the practical demonstration.
 - the activities in the observation checklist are signed off by the supervisor and not individually signed off by the assessor, so it is not evident that the assessor is responsible for observing and verifying the learner's demonstration of skills.
 - The tools are not reliable as they do not provide the context and conditions of assessment for the practical assessment of this unit in the Work Placement Book.

- Provide revised assessment tools to demonstrate that assessment meets the requirements of the training package and is conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and rules of evidence for the following units:


